Some Year 2 children had the amazing opportunity to sing on stage at the Guildhall during Infant Voices. All children had a Hampshire Cricket Day and a whole school visit to St Margaret's Church to reinforce their R.E learning about Easter.

Geography and English were at the heart of the learning last term, with Year 1 exploring Portsmouth the Great Waterfront City, with a local walk and minibus tours of the city. 


Free items
