### Dear Parents/Carers

Now restrictions have been lifted, I wanted to share with you the plans we have for Cumberland in September. We are hoping that this will all go ahead and the government will not change their mind over the summer holidays!

# **Return to school**

Children in Year 1 and Year 2 will return to school on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September, with their P.E kit, book bag and looking very smart in their school uniform. We will return to the normal school start time of 8.50am and pick up will return to the normal pick up time of 3.15pm.

Children in Year R will have a morning and afternoon session with fifteen of their new class on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September and Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September. Parents have been informed when their child will attend.

Little Cumberland Pre-school will also open their doors at 8.30am on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September.

### **Dropping off your child/children**

We will be changing how parents drop their children off and pick them up. We will ask all parents to enter and leave the playground through the black gates on Methuen Road. Staff will come out to the playground to collect the children. I will send further details about the organisation of drop off and pick up at the end of August.

Over the autumn term, we will be developing the outside area into a new Early Years outside classroom so we ask all parents and children to remain in the main playground to drop off and pick up their children.

## Early morning drop off

From Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September, we will be running the early morning drop off from 8.30am but it will be part of our Breakfast Club so we will be continuing to charge a £1 a day. ## Reading and poetry morning

As a school, we have decided to have one session that parents are invited to attend to share books and read to their child. This used to be in the morning but we found it could be quite unsettling for several children so we have decided to start a reading afternoon. Parents are invited in every Tuesday between 3pm-3.15pm to read with your child. During this reading session, we ask parents to read with their child and other children whose parents cannot attend. It is a time to share books and promote the love of reading with all the children in the school. During this short reading sessions, we would like all parents to not to use their mobile phones and that any younger siblings who attend are also joining in with the reading. The first reading afternoon will be on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2021 at 3pm.
